He asked to talk on curriculum implementation and respecting diversity. Trustee Allan and myself met with MLA Glubish to speak on Sherwood Heights replacement school and reserve cap. The Board met with the Minister of Education on September 13. We used our 30 minutes to speak on capital project process and our concerns as it relates to Sherwood Heights, modular project requests and reserve cap. The Board heid a special meeting on September 1 to approve making a request to the Minister of Education to access \$1M from operating reserves and \$1.1M from capital reserves to offset the cost of replacing the storm water drainage pipes at Sal. The full cost of the project is estimated at \$4.1M. The Board elected the Chair and Vice Chair for the 2022-23 year. I'm honoured to serve a 10th consecutive term as Chair of the Board. I look forward to continuing to work along with Colleen Holowaychuk as Vice Chair. Public engagement sessions that started in June will continue, as we are back out to share what we heard and gather any further thoughts. 

	 The Board approved status quo calendars for the 2023-24 and 2024-25 school years. On October 26 EIPS started a new public engagement discussion that is looking at the best way to strengthen the secondary French Immersion program. Discussions will also include location of the program. 	

	 Last month the Board launched its first Quarterly communication to parents and staff that highlight the Board's advocacy efforts November 8 MLA Walk arranged to for us to discuss any concerns that EIPS has that he should be aware of. We discussed concerns with delayed decision on what format that Sherwood Heights will be built through, and we are still waiting to hear from the Minister about our request to access more of our reserves to address Salisbury Composite storm water drainage issue. On November 17, at the public Board meeting the Board presented with feedback received through various public engagement sessions to deal with cleaning up some of our junior high attendance areas. No recommendation or decision will be made about the junior high attendance area at this meeting. Senior Administration needs more time to complete two other public engagement before the Superintendent will determine his recommendation to the Board. Given that the recommendation is now projected to come after the 2023-24 registration, there will be no changes to the junior high boundaries for the 2023-24 school year. School Assurance Reviews will be conducted the first week of December this year instead of the end of November due to the late release of the PAT and DIP results.  The Board held a Board Retreat on November 29 and 30 to work on our workplan, identify advocacy priorities and finalizing our Board Evaluation. Special attention will be given to monitoring progress being made with our COVID recovery plan, completing our 2022-23 public engagements work and the upcoming provincial election. Advocacy efforts will focus on curriculum, infrastructure needs, mental health and funding A summary of the Logos public engagements was presented for the Board's information, at the December 15 Board meeting. The next public engagement session for French Immersion is tentatively scheduled for February 7 EIPS's mental health pilot, with a focus on junior high, proposal was approved, and we will be receiving \$1.94 over 2 years. We have received news that Sherwood Heights will proceed through a design build and not a P3. The remaining of the design work will continue under Alberta Infrastructure. We remain hopeful that we will be able to manage the construction phase. Our request to access more of our operating reserves to cover the some of the costs to address Salisbury Composite storm water drainage issue has been approved by the minister and the funds have been transferred into our Capital reserves. Board held a special meeting on January 5 approve allocation of contingency funds (\$1.68M) and reallocation of dollars that have been declared surplus for their intended purpose (\$1.78M). The \$3.46M will go towards emergent items, complete additional work and projects that is required to be completed this year, increase in early learning supports and purchase to prepare for the change to Windows 11. As well, \$902K is being allocated to schools. Each school will receive \$10K and per student allocation model will be used for distributing the remaining funds. The school will be required to expend the dollars in this year. Reregistration Process will begin February 1 to February 28. There are five schools with close boundaries fo
